Teacher Uses

Speaking Prompts:

- Generate conversation questions
- Generate dialogs with target grammar and/or vocabulary centered on situations relevant to students' lives

Writing and Grammar

- Teach students about different registers (levels of formality)
- Teach summarization and paraphrasing
- Generate model paragraphs and essays

Vocabulary

- Generate vocabulary lists with definitions and sample sentences
- Get definitions, etymology, example sentences and dialogs for idioms, phrasal verbs
- Teach collocations – use as a corpora

Materials Development

- Generate sentences, paragraphs, and stories for vocabulary and grammar introduction, practice exercises including cloze/gap fill, and quizzes
- Generate leveled reading texts/writing samples along with questions based on the passages to differentiate the instruction

Sample Class Project Prompt

Provide a simple rubric for the project and "I can" statements for students based on the CCRS and the rubric.

Caveats and Limitations

- Output may not be current or accurate; "hallucinations"
- Based on human texts = results may have bias

Student Uses

Speaking

- Generate dialogs for difficult conversations – job interview, asking for a promotion or raise, talking to teachers

Idea generation

- Generate ideas for writing assignments, conversations
- Enter their writing or a conversation to make it more academic or formal

Writing and Grammar

- Critique CHATGPT writing against a rubric and rewrite to make it better
- Enter a writing prompt and compare the ChatGPT output with their own writing; explain the changes they make to their own writing based on the comparison
- Get explanations for errors, help writing topic sentences and conclusions
- Get a starter resume, cover letter, letter or email to employers, kids' teachers, others

Vocabulary

- Get definitions, parts of speech, sample sentences for vocabulary, phrasal verbs, idioms
- Get translations

Teacher Concerns: Student Cheating and Plagiarism

Suggested ways to deal with these concerns:

- AI text generator plagiarism detectors are not reliable and have been shown to be biased against nonnative English speakers
- Have a class discussion and have students express in their own words why cheating or plagiarism with AI text generators won't help them in the long term build their skills
- Start with non-negotiables and by setting clear expectations (use the tool with the following parameters or don't use it), co-construct with students, as their level of understanding allows, a class set of policies
- Example norms for use: "Don't trust anything - cross-check with at least one other source and cite your sources, including ChatGPT when used for an assignment; if you make changes on your writing based on feedback from ChatGPT, describe those changes and explain why you made them; there are ChatGPT detectors, so use it as a tool but don't copy verbatim from it - that's plagiarism"

AI Tool #2: Image Generators

[Dall-E](#) - generate digital images from natural language descriptions OR upload images to edit or regenerate in other ways.

Teacher Uses

- Generate original, unlicensed, free images or upload images to alter
- Get an interesting, thought-provoking image for a quick write for students or to elicit vocabulary or tap into background knowledge
- Produce novel images to use as prompts for student descriptive and collaborative writing

Example 1: Student A writes a description and copies it into Dall-E to generate an image. The image is given to Student B. Student B writes a description based on the image. The two descriptions are compared and a third description is written by both students in collaboration to combine the best parts.

Example 2: Students provided an image of a real artwork. They enter descriptions to generate output of the image as close as they can, editing their descriptions as they go to get a better output.

Student Uses

- Create images that are customized specific to their needs (e.g., to accompany their writing or as visuals for oral presentations and projects)
- Enter a vocabulary word to get an image of the word and make class dictionaries or word walls with the images.

Caveats and Limitations

- 15 free images a month per account
- Lack of human diversity if prompt not specific
- Quality issues, especially for realistic images of people
- Contention regarding artist integrity; violation of intellectual property questions
- Noncommercial use of images
